A municipality will have to be formed, who will elect their own Assessors and Treasurer, the Government merely auditing the accounts. The Legislative Council will assemble some time in March to frame the Ordinance, and in the meanwhile the Governor will gladly receive any suggestions on the part

Whereas the Ordinance No 6 of 1870
entitled "An Amalgamation Ordinance of the
Leases of Crown Lands in the Falkland Islands"
has been disallowed. Now, therefore, I
the said Governor do hereby proclaim
that pending the consideration of certain
amendments in the laws respecting the
occupation, leasing and sale of land
within this Colony; no further leases
or licenses will be issued, except
under the terms of the Proclamation
of the 4th April 1861, so far as the East
Falklands are concerned, and of the
Proclamation of the 24th June 1867, so far
as the West Falkland Islands are concerned.

All licenses for the occupation of
land which have expired or shall expire
before Her Majesty's approval of the land
regulations shall be signified, and may
be renewable for another year, or for
such other period as may be deemed
expedient, on payment of six pounds per

Whereas it has been considered expedient that the Pilot Ordinance No 7 of 1870 should be suspended for the further consideration of certain alterations and emendations proposed to be made therein. Notice is hereby given that the Pilot and Harbour Ordinance No 8 of 1853 now still continues in force as the Law of the Colony; until such time as any future Law hereafter enacted may be submitted for confirmation of Her Majesty.

And further notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the Ordinance No 8 of 1853 I do hereby suspend the Pilot and Harbour Regulations passed on the 24 September 1857 and make and publish the following Port Regulations for Stanley Harbour.

PORT REGULATIONS.

“Whereas by the Pilot Ordinance No. 7 1870. it is enacted, that the Governor shall from time to time make regulations respecting the duties of and payment to the Pilots, and all other matters connected therewith, and respecting the landing, deposit, and removal of gunpowder, the watering, ballasting, or discharging of ballast from Ships and respecting all other matters connected with the safe and commodious navigation of any Harbour in the Falkland Islands.” The following rules are hereby to be enforced.—

Compulsory Pilotage.

1. Every vessel except vessels of War and Colonial vessels arriving at or leaving Stanley Harbour shall take a Pilot.

Master to supply information

2. Every Master of a Ship is bound to declare her Registered tonnage to the Pilot who takes charge of her and shall furnish to the Pilot or Harbour Master on demand, a statement of particulars for the information of the Governor, for which purpose a blank form will be presented to the master by the Pilot in charge.

Deposit of Ship's Papers and Manifest,

3. The Masters of all Vessels anchoring in this Harbour or in Port William to the Westward of a line drawn from Cape Pembroke to William Point, shall within twenty four hours of their arrival, deposit their Ship's papers at the Government Office, which papers will be returned to the Masters on application within a reasonable time before their departure. Provided that the Masters of Foreign vessels belonging to nations which are represented at this Port by Consuls or Commercial Agents shall deposit their ship's papers at their respective Consulates instead of at the Government Office; but in every case the Manifest of Cargo shall be produced to the Custom House Officer, within 24 hours after casting anchor.

Quarantine.

4. No person is to be allowed to land from any vessel having on board any infectious or contagious disease without permission from the Governor, signified through the Pilot; and every master must answer such enquiries as to the sanitary condition of his vessel as may be made by the Pilot, and no Boat is to be allowed to board any vessel till at anchor nor even then in case of there being any infectious disease. The Masters of vessels are therefore enjoined not to allow themselves to be boarded by any boat from the shore until they have received the Pilot on board, given the required information and read the Port Regulations, and received pratique.

Permit required for landing Spirits &c.

5. Every master of a ship must before landing any Spirits, Wine or Beer take out a Permit from the Officer of Customs under penalty of £50. imposed by the Spirit Duties Ordinance No. 3 of 1870.

Harbour.

Watering.

6. Any vessel requiring water may obtain it from the Government Reservoir, on application to the harbour-master, and payment of two shillings and sixpence a tun.

Discharging Ballast.

7. Any shipmaster wishing to discharge ballast will communicate with the harbour-master, who will point out where it is to be placed.

Gunpowder.

8. Any merchant vessel having on board more than One hundred pounds of gunpowder must be anchored either in Port William or in Stanley Harbour, east of "Navy Point," unless the master will deposit the same (during his stay) in the powder magazine, for which a charge of sixpence per package is to be made.

No shotted cannon to be allowed.

9. No Master or other officer commanding any vessel (except any vessel of war) shall keep or cause or permit to be fired any cannon on board such vessel loaded with ball, while such vessel shall lie or be in Stanley Harbour.

Position of hulks.

10. No hulk shall be permanently moored between the east end of Stanley (as defined in Governor Rennie's proclamation of 22nd October 1853) and a line drawn northwards from Villiers Street.

Moving hulks.

11. Any hulks intended to be brought within these limits, for the purpose of receiving or discharging cargo, must be moved under the direction of the harbour-master.

Fee to harbour master.

12. For moving any vessel in Stanley Harbour, the harbour-master may demand a fee of One pound. Vessels must not be moved without the sanction of the harbour-master.

Pilotage.

Pilotage inwards.

The rate of pilotage inwards for every vessel drawing less than ten feet shall be sixty shillings; and for every vessel drawing ten feet or more six-shillings per foot.

Pilotage outwards.

The rate of Pilotage outwards shall be one half the rate inwards.

Harbour-master to board all vessels.

14. All Colonial and other vessels will on arrival be boarded by the Harbour Master or his Deputy.

Pilots.

15. Pilots to carry in their boat a flag to be approved by the Governor.

Pilot Flag.

Leading a Ship.

16. Pilots if unable to get on board to lead the Ship in the Pilot boat.

Pilots required to board.

17. Pilots are required to board the nearest vessel having a signal flying for a Pilot, except there should be a vessel in sight with a signal of distress.

Pilots to report.

18. Immediately on landing the Pilot in charge to give information to the Governor respecting the Ship.

Offences penalties for.

19. By the "^{and Harbour} Pilot Ordinance," Section 7, it is enacted, that any master, pilot, or other person who shall offend against these the regulations made by the Governor in pursuance of the said Ordinance, shall pay a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

The following Rules for the Government School having been approved of by the Governor are published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command

RULES OF GOVERNMENT SCHOOL. STANLEY.

1. The school is to be opened for all children between 4 and 15 years of age.
2. The school to commence each morning during summer with prayers in the Church, when the Colonial Chaplain is present, in winter the school to commence at 9, 30. Morning School to close at 12. Afternoon school to commence at 2 o'clock, and the school to be closed at 4 o'clock prayers having been read by the Chaplain in the Church. Saturday to be a whole holiday. *Punctuality to be most strictly enforced.*
3. All children are to pay to the Schoolmaster 3d. a week in advance, Children of the Garrison to pay according to the Queen's Regulations.
4. The afternoon school for the Girls to be devoted to needle work under the School Mistress.
5. The religious instruction for Members of the Church of England, shall be given especially by the Colonial Chaplain, at the daily morning and afternoon services, and in the Church at such further times as he may think necessary.
6. That the Parents who object to the religious instruction of their Children, may have them exempted on written application to the Inspectors of Schools, such application to be laid before His Excellency the Governor, care being taken that such exemption does not interfere with the discipline of the School.
7. That reports certified by the Inspector or Inspectors be made quarterly to H. E. the Governor, showing the number of the Children, on the School list, the average daily attendance and other matters respecting the progress of Education.
8. The Colonial Chaplain in virtue of his office and any other person or persons appointed by His Excellency shall be Inspector or Inspectors of Schools. The school is always open to the visits of Inspectors, or others introduced by them and to any who take an active interest in the progress of Girl's work, when button hole making, and other plain work may be seen, and the ability of the workers can be tested. No work to be taken out of the School between the Examinations.
9. That as far as possible to assist the Schoolmaster, 3 boys and 3 Girls be selected as Monitors.
10. The Monitors are to receive special instructions from, and to be periodically examined by the Inspector or Inspectors.
11. In the needle work where the Children do not bring work for their Parents, work for a public or charitable object to be given them to do.
12. Books and Stationery supplied by the Government to be sold at cost price, and the amount accounted for quarterly to the officer appointed by his Excellency the Governor.
13. A time table of School work to be strictly enforced, and a copy of the table to be supplied to the Governor, Inspectors, and generally for the information of the public. The only deviation to be made on the authority of the Governor or Inspectors.
14. The Prizes to be distributed at Christmas and at the end of June on a system proposed by the Inspectors and sanctioned by the Governor. The holidays to be appointed by His Excellency the Governor. One half holiday a month to be in the power of the Inspector or Inspectors to grant.
15. When arrangements can be made an Evening School to be established on the principles of these rules.

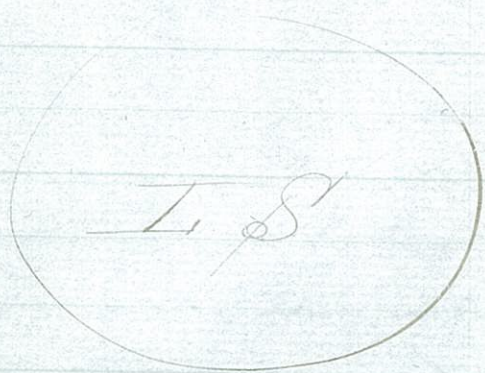
