"Christmas Day, or Good Fridays, or at any house or bar, or under the management of any other person other than as specified in the licence, or to any drunken person, or by retail or credit either directly or indirectly by the pretended loan of money, sale of goods or otherwise or shall take in payment anything except money, or shall take anything in pledge, or seize or take into his possession any goods as security for any liquor sold by retail, or shall permit in or upon his house or premises drunkenness, tippling, disorderly conduct, fighting, disturbance, or any unlawful game or gaming whatsoever, or shall not maintain good order to the best of his ability."

(1) If the person so finding or taking possession of the same is the Owner he shall as soon as possible give notice to the Receiver of Wrecks stating that he has so found or taken possession of the same, and he shall describe in such notice the marks by which such wreck is distinguished.

(2) If any person not being the Owner finds or takes possession of any wreck he shall as soon as possible deliver the same to such Receiver as aforesaid.

Any person making default in obeying the provisions of this section is liable to the heavy penalties prescribed therefor.

It is to be observed that the above notice required to be given to the Receiver is to be quite separate from the usual return of particulars sent in to the Governor for his information.
