Whereas by Colonial Ordinance No 3
of 1857 it is enacted as follows:-

Clause 2.- That all the powers, authorities, and
duties committed by the said Act to any
Officer of Customs, or any Shipping Master, shall
(until there be an Officer of Customs in the
Colony) be vested in, and exercised by, the
Colonial Secretary, and all provisions, offences,
and penalties, relating to the performance or
neglect of any Act required by the Merchant
Shipping Act to be done before any such Officer
of Customs, or Shipping Master, shall extend
and be applied to any such Act performed or neglected
before the Colonial Secretary.
