

Now, Therefore, I, WILLIAM LAMOND ALLARDYCE, do hereby publish, promulgate, and proclaim, that His Most Excellent Majesty the King hath strictly charged and commanded all His loving subjects to govern themselves accordingly and to observe a strict neutrality in and during the aforesaid war and to abstain from violating or contravening either "an act to regulate the conduct of Her Majesty's subjects during the existence of hostilities between Foreign States with which her Majesty is at Peace," or the Laws and Statutes of the Ream in this behalf, or the Law of Nations or any Treaty made by His Majesty in relation thereto, or the Rules which His Majesty has directed to be observed during the continuance of the present state of war, as they will answer to the contrary at their peril.

Notice of His Excellency the Governor in Council declaring the Registration Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912, to be in force in the Dependencies.

In pursuance of the powers in him vested by section 3 of the Dependencies Ordinance, 1908, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declares the Registration Ordinance, No. IX of 1912, to be in force in the Dependencies as far as circumstances permit and local conditions render necessary.
