### An Ordinance

Title.

To provide for the Public Service of the  
financial year ending the 30th day of June 1983.

Date of commencement.

(1st July 1982)

Preamble.

WHEREAS due to the recent occupation of the Colony by alien military forces the expenditure required for the service of the Colony for the financial year ending on the 30th day of June 1983 has been estimated provisionally at the sum of Three million, five hundred thousand pounds:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, as follows —

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation (Provisional) Ordinance 1982.

Appropriation of  
£1,714,000 from the  
general revenues and other  
funds.

2. A sum not exceeding One million, seven hundred and fourteen thousand pounds shall be and the same is hereby charged provisionally upon the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the service of the financial year commencing on the 1st day of July 1982, and ending on the 30th day of June 1983, and the said sum so charged may be expended in the manner expressed in the Schedule.

## An Ordinance To provide for the service of the year 1982-83.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands.

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as the Short title.  
Appropriation (1982-83) Ordinance 1982.

2. Title.

EDUCATION ORDINANCE 1967  
**School (Amendment) Regulations 1982**

No. 1 of 1982.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 16 of the Education Ordinance 1967, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations —

1. These regulations may be cited as the School (Amendment) Regulations 1982 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January 1982.

Citation and commencement.

2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following —

Replacement of regulation 4.

"School terms and holidays.

4. (1) For recognised Stanley schools, the school year shall be of three terms, the first of fourteen weeks, the second of twelve weeks and the third of thirteen weeks duration, so arranged to allow a holiday of three weeks in June, three weeks in September and seven weeks, commencing with and including, the Thursday of the week preceding the week in which Christmas day occurs; such dates to be notified by publication in the Gazette.

(2) A mid-term holiday not exceeding one day in duration may be granted in each term to children in the reception classes of the Infant School at the discretion of the Headmaster.

(3) Recognised schools in Camp shall take the same holidays as Stanley schools, though the Superintendent may authorise changes in these dates to coincide with farm holidays if so petitioned by farm managers, provided that such alternative arrangements do not reduce the total number of days worked in the year."

## BY THE QUEEN A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN FOR, AND GIVING CURRENCY  
TO, SILVER AND CUPRO-NICKEL COINS IN HER MAJESTY'S COLONY OF THE  
FALKLAND ISLANDS

*ELIZABETH R*

*MARGARET*

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letter Patent dated the 30th day of September 1982, to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to approve and sign on Her Majesty's behalf any Proclamation relating to the affairs of any of Her Majesty's Colonies and to do on Her Majesty's behalf anything required to be done in relation to any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, We, Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870, section 2 (3) of the Decimal Currency Act 1967, and of all other powers enabling Her Majesty, and by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, do on Her Majesty's behalf proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

1. This Proclamation shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Falkland Islands and shall come into force there on the date of such publication.

2. (1) The following new coins, being coins of a standard weight of 28.2759 grammes, a standard diameter of 38.608 millimetres and of a circular shape, shall be made —

- (a) a silver coin of millesimal fineness 925; and
- (b) a cupro-nickel coin of a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel.

(2) In the making of the silver coin prescribed by section 2 (1) (a) of this Proclamation a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1296 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard composition of millesimal fineness of 5.

(3) In the making of the cupro-nickel coin prescribed by section 2 (1) (b) of this Proclamation a remedy shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1296 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.

3. The design for the said coins shall be as follows —

- (a) For the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty with the inscription "QUEEN ELIZABETH II" to the left of the portrait with "FALKLAND ISLANDS" to the right and at the bottom "50 PENCE".
- (b) For the reverse impression a background of the Union Flag, to the left the Arms of the Falkland Islands with the inscription "LIBERATION" above and "14 JUNE 1982" below.
- (c) Every silver and cupro-nickel coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

4. The said coins shall be current within Her Majesty's Colony of the Falkland Islands.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the British Settlements Acts 1887 and 1945 (a), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows —

*Citation and Commencement*

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Falkland Islands and Dependencies (Interim Administration) Order 1982.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on 18th June 1982.

*Interpretation*

2. In this Order —

“the Colony” and “the Dependencies” have the same meanings as in the Letters Patent;

“the Executive Council” means the Executive Council of the Colony as established by the Letters Patent;

“the Legislative Council” means the Legislative Council of the Colony as established by the Falkland Islands (Legislative Council) Orders in Council, 1948 to 1977 (b);

“the Letters Patent” means the Falkland Islands Letters Patent, 1948 to 1962 (c);

“the Royal Instructions” means the Instructions passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and the Dependencies of 13th December 1948, as amended (d).

*Civil Commissioner and Military Commissioner*

3. For so long as this Order remains in force there shall be a Civil Commissioner and a Military Commissioner in and for the Colony and the Dependencies who shall be appointed and have such functions as hereinafter provided.

*Establishment of Office of Civil Commissioner*

4. (1) The Civil Commissioner shall be appointed by Her Majesty by Commission under Her Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or by instructions given through a Secretary of State, and shall hold office during Her Majesty's pleasure.

(2) During any period when the office of Civil Commissioner is vacant or the holder thereof is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office those functions shall, during Her Majesty's pleasure, be assumed and performed by such person as Her Majesty may designate in that behalf by instructions given through a Secretary of State.

*Establishment of Office of Military Commissioner*

5. The Military Commissioner shall be the Officer for the time being commanding Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony and the

Dependencies and shall, acting as appropriate through the Civil Commissioner, have responsibility for the defence and internal security (with the exception of the police) of the Colony and the Dependencies.

*Powers and Duties of the Commissioners*

6. The Civil Commissioner and the Military Commissioner shall each have such powers and duties as are conferred upon them by or under this Order or any other law, and such other powers and duties as Her Majesty may from time to time be pleased to assign to them, and, subject to the provisions of this Order and any other law, each Commissioner shall do or execute all things that belong to his office according to such instructions, if any, as Her Majesty may, through a Secretary of State, from time to time see fit to give him.

*Exercise of the Governor's Functions*

7. (1) For so long as this Order is in force —
  - (a) the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Dependencies is suspended and the provisions of Article 7 of the Letters Patent shall not have effect;
  - (b) the functions of that office shall vest in and be exercisable by the Civil Commissioner in accordance with the provisions of this Order; and
  - (c) all references to the Governor or to the officer administering the Government in any law (including the Royal Instructions) for the time being in force in the Colony or the Dependencies shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as references to the Civil Commissioner.

(2) The Civil Commissioner shall consult with the Military Commissioner before exercising any function which appears to the Civil Commissioner to relate to defence or internal security (with the exception of the police) and shall act in accordance with the advice which the Military Commissioner then tenders to him; and he shall likewise act in accordance with the advice of the Military Commissioner on any matter on which the Military Commissioner considers it necessary in the interests of his responsibilities under this Order to give advice to the Civil Commissioner: Provided that the question whether the Civil Commissioner has on any matter consulted with the Military Commissioner or acted in accordance with his advice shall not be enquired into in any Court.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 10 of the Royal Instructions, the Civil Commissioner need not consult with the Executive Council on any matter on which he is required by subsection (2) of this section to consult with the Military Commissioner or on which the Military Commissioner has already, in accordance with the provisions of that subsection, given advice to him.

*Military Commissioner to attend Executive and Legislative Councils*

8. The Military Commissioner shall have the right to attend and take part in the proceedings of the Executive Council and of the Legislative Council, but shall not have the right to vote in either Council.

*Existing Law*

9. (1) The provisions of this Order shall have effect notwithstanding the provision of any existing law and such law shall be applied with such adaptations, modifications and exceptions as are necessary to bring it into conformity with the provisions of this Order.

(2) For the purposes of this subsection, "existing law" means any law (including the Royal Instructions) in force in the Colony or the Dependencies immediately before the commencement of this Order.

*Powers reserved to Her Majesty*

10. (1) Her Majesty hereby reserves to Herself, Her Heirs and Successors, powers with the advice of Her or Their Privy Council, to revoke, add to or amend this Order as to Her or Them shall seem fit.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers of Her Majesty in Council to make laws from time to time for the peace, order and good government of the Colony and the Dependencies.

## Colony of the Falkland Islands

*Civil Commissioner.*

### An Ordinance

To provide for the establishment of the Falkland Islands Development Corporation, for the economic development of the Falkland Islands and for matters connected therewith.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Falkland Islands Development Corporation Ordinance 1983 and shall come into force on such day as the Civil Commissioner may appoint by order published in the Gazette.

Citation and commencement.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires —

Interpretation.

“the Chief Accountant” means the Chief Accountant provided for in Section 9;

“the Chief Executive” means the Chief Secretary or the person for the time being discharging the functions of Chief Secretary;

“the Corporation” means the Corporation established under Section 3;

“the Executive” means the Executive Board provided for in Section 12;

“the financial year” means the financial year of the Corporation which shall be such period of twelve calendar months as the Financial Secretary shall declare by order published in the Gazette;

“the General Manager” means the general manager provided for in Section 8;

“Her Majesty's Government” means Her Majesty's Government for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Establishment of the Corporation.

3. (1) There is hereby established a body corporate to be known as the "Falkland Islands Development Corporation".

(2) The Corporation shall have perpetual succession and a common seal and may sue or be sued in its corporate name.

Functions of the Corporation.

4. The Corporation shall —

- (a) encourage and assist in the economic development of the Falkland Islands;
- (b) advise the Falkland Islands Government on such matters relating to economic development as it may refer to the Corporation or as the Corporation may consider fit; and
- (c) examine and advise on proposals referred to the Corporation by the Executive Council relating to the imposition or revision of tariffs, taxes, duties, quotas or other protective or developmental measures.

Powers of the Corporation.

5. (1) The Corporation may do all things necessary and convenient for the carrying out of its functions.

(2) Without derogating from the generality of subsection (1) the Corporation may —

- (a) acquire, hold and dispose of immoveable and other property including houses and other accommodation for occupation by employees and advisers of the Corporation or for sale, leasing or renting from the Corporation by other persons;
- (b) carry out building and other operations;
- (c) promote or finance any undertakings;
- (d) borrow money by the issue of debentures or in any other manner including bank overdraft within the Falkland Islands and likewise borrow money outside the Falkland Islands with the prior consent of the Secretary of State which may be given generally or specifically;
- (e) make loans with or without security;
- (f) guarantee any loan;
- (g) administer monies provided for purposes of economic development of the Falkland Islands either by Her Majesty's Government or by the Falkland Islands Government or both on behalf of either or both of those Governments and subject to such conditions as may be laid down by them or either of them;
- (h) establish or participate in any pension or provident fund schemes for the benefit of its employees and their dependants;
- (i) carry out programmes of research;
- (j) establish training programmes;
- (k) sponsor competitions;
- (l) publish printed, audio or audio visual matter for sale or otherwise;
- (m) acquire copyright; and
- (n) charge fees for services rendered by it.

Composition of the Corporation.

6. (1) The Corporation shall consist of the Civil Commissioner who shall be chairman and ten other members seven of whom shall be appointed by the Civil Commissioner and who shall be —

- (a) a representative of Her Majesty's Government who shall be nominated by the Secretary of State;
- (b) an elected member of the Executive Council who shall be elected by that Council;

- (c) a person not being a member of the Executive Council who the Civil Commissioner in Council considers represents the interests of farmers in the Falkland Islands;
- (d) two persons, who the Civil Commissioner in Council considers have had experience in matters relating to trade or industry; and
- (e) two persons holding public office in the Falkland Islands.

(2) The Chief Executive, the General Manager, and the Financial Secretary shall be members of the board, ex officio.

(3) Subject to subsections (4) and (5) members of the Corporation other than the Civil Commissioner and the members referred to in subsection (2) shall serve for a term of three years but shall be eligible for reappointment.

(4) Should the Civil Commissioner in Council be satisfied that a member of the Corporation appointed under subsection (1) other than the representative of Her Majesty's Government —

- (a) has been absent from a meeting of the Corporation without reasonable excuse;
- (b) has become insolvent;
- (c) is incapacitated by physical or mental illness;
- (d) has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude; or
- (e) is otherwise unable or unfit to discharge the functions of a member;

the Civil Commissioner may by notice published in the Gazette declare the office of the member vacant.

(5) A member of the Corporation appointed by the Civil Commissioner in accordance with subsection (1) may resign by not less than thirty days notice in writing given to the Civil Commissioner or by a shorter notice if the Civil Commissioner consents.

7. The Chief Executive shall be the Executive Vice Chairman of the Corporation and as such shall, subject to the provisions of Sections 9 and 10, have power to appoint employees of the Corporation.

Executive Vice Chairman.

8. (1) The Executive Vice Chairman after consultation with the Civil Commissioner in Council and with the Secretary of State, the General Manager of the Corporation shall be the Corporation.

General Manager.

and terms of appointment of the General Manager shall be contained in his contract of appointment entered into with him by the Executive Vice Chairman after consultation with the Civil Commissioner and with the Secretary of State.

(3) The General Manager shall be the chief officer of the Corporation and of all its operations.

(4) The Executive may by resolution or otherwise delegate to the General Manager, with or without restrictions or conditions, such of the powers and functions of the Corporation as it may consider expedient for the day to day operation of the Corporation.

9. The Corporation shall appoint a Chief Accountant of the Corporation.

Chief Accountant.

10. (1) There shall be a Secretary to the Corporation who shall be an employee thereof and shall be appointed by the Corporation.

Secretary.

(2) The Secretary or a person acting as such shall attend all meetings of the Corporation and prepare the minutes thereof.

(3) The Secretary shall keep in safe custody the seal and all documents of the Corporation; receive all legal process and all notices

served on the Corporation and carry out such other duties as the Corporation or General Manager shall direct.

Meetings of the Corporation.

11. (1) The Corporation shall meet two times in every twelve months.

(2) The first meeting of the Corporation shall be held not less than thirty days after the coming into force of this Ordinance.

(3) Subject to subsection (4), the Civil Commissioner after consultation with the representative on the Corporation of Her Majesty's Government shall convene the two meetings of the Corporation provided for in subsection (1) and likewise may convene extraordinary meetings.

(4) The Civil Commissioner shall at the request in writing of not less than five members of the Corporation convene an extraordinary meeting of the Corporation.

(5) Not less than thirty days notice in writing shall be given of meetings of the Corporation but the Corporation may retrospectively or otherwise resolve to accept a shorter notice.

(6) The quorum at meetings shall be five members.

(7) The proceedings at any meeting shall not be invalidated by any defect in the appointment of any participating member or vacancies in the membership of the Corporation provided that the number of such vacancies does not exceed four.

(8) The representative of Her Majesty's Government may appoint an alternate to represent him and vote on his behalf at any meeting of the Corporation.

(9) Where a member has a direct or indirect financial interest in a matter being considered by the Corporation he shall disclose that interest and may not take part in any vote thereon at any meeting.

(10) The Corporation may invite persons to participate in meetings but they shall have no vote.

(11) Decisions of the Corporation shall be made by a majority vote of members present and voting, the chairman of the meeting having a casting vote.

(12) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (11) no decision at a meeting of the Corporation involving the expenditure of funds of the Corporation may be made unless the Civil Commissioner or the representative of Her Majesty's Government is present.

(13) Subject to this Ordinance the Corporation may make internal rules regulating its procedure for the chairmanship, calling and conducting of meetings of the Corporation.

Executive.

12. (1) There shall be an Executive Board of the Corporation.

(2) The Executive shall, subject to Section 15, be responsible for the operations of the Corporation.

Membership of Executive.

13. The Executive shall consist of —

- (a) the Executive Vice Chairman who shall be chairman;
- (b) the General Manager;
- (c) the Chief Accountant; and
- (d) a member of the Corporation elected by the Corporation who shall serve on the Executive for three years or the period for which he remains a member of the Corporation, whichever period is the shorter and may be reelected thereto.

Meetings of the Executive.

14. (1) The Executive shall hold not less than six meetings in every twelve months.

(2) Meetings of the Executive shall be convened by the Executive Vice Chairman.

(3) The quorum of the Executive shall be three members.

(4) The Executive Vice Chairman shall call extraordinary meetings of the Executive on the written request of the other members.

(5) Not less than fourteen days notice in writing shall be given of meetings of the Executive but the Executive may retrospectively or otherwise resolve to accept shorter notice.

(6) Subsections (9), (10), (11) and (13) of Section 11 shall apply to the Executive except that the Executive shall be substituted for the Corporation in those subsections.

(7) The proceedings of any meeting of the Executive shall not be invalidated by one vacancy in its membership.

15. The Corporation may, by resolution, give directions in writing to the Executive under the hand of the chairman of the meeting at which the resolution was passed —

Directions to the Executive by the Corporation.

- (a) on matters of policy;
- (b) the exercise of the power contained in Section 5 (2) (g); or
- (c) prescribing:
  - (i) the aggregate maximum indebtedness that the Corporation may incur without its consent, or
  - (ii) the maximum individual sums that the Corporation may likewise borrow.

16. The funds of the Corporation shall consist of —

Funds of the Corporation.

- (a) grants from Her Majesty's Government and from the Falkland Islands Government;
- (b) grants from other sources;
- (c) monies borrowed by the Corporation; and
- (d) monies received by the Corporation in the course of the discharge of its functions.

17. Any funds of the Corporation not immediately required for the carrying out of its functions may be placed on interest bearing deposit with a bank or invested either in securities approved in writing by the Financial Secretary or such other securities as may be authorised by law for the investment of trust funds.

Temporary investment of funds.

18. The Falkland Islands Government may guarantee any loans to the Corporation on such conditions as it may consider fit.

Guarantee of loans.

19. (1) The Corporation shall keep proper accounts and other records in respect of its receipts and expenditure and shall cause to be prepared an annual statement of accounts in respect of each financial year.

Accounts and Audit.

(2) The accounts of the Corporation shall be audited annually by independent and properly qualified auditors approved in writing by the Financial Secretary and appointed by the Corporation.

(3) As soon as is reasonable after the end of the financial year the Corporation shall transmit to the Civil Commissioner and the Secretary of State audited accounts and any report made by the auditors thereon and such explanations as the Corporation may consider appropriate together with estimates of receipts and expenditure of the Corporation for the current financial year.

20. (1) The Executive shall make an annual report of the activities of the Corporation to the Civil Commissioner and the Secretary of State not less than thirty days before the annual budget session of the Legislative Council.

Annual Reports.

(2) A copy of the audited accounts and estimates provided for in Section 19 shall be attached to the report.

(3) The Civil Commissioner shall submit the annual report together with such comments as he may have thereon —

- (a) to the Legislative Council during its annual budget session; and
- (b) to the Corporation at its annual meeting.

(4) Upon submission to the Civil Commissioner and the Secretary of State of its Annual Report and audited accounts in accordance with subsections (1) and (2) the Corporation shall cause copies thereof to be printed and made available to members of the public upon payment, in the discretion of the Corporation, of a charge to cover the costs of printing and making such copies available.

Submission of Estimates  
for purposes of grant.

21. (1) If the Corporation shall need either of the grants referred to in Section 16 (a) it shall not less than ninety days before the commencement of the financial year of the Government from whom it wishes to obtain a grant submit to that Government estimates of expenditure and receipts for that year and of unexpended funds carried forward.

(2) Nothing contained in subsection (1) shall hinder the Corporation from applying for and receiving grants from either Her Majesty's Government or the Falkland Islands Government which have not been provided for in estimates submitted in accordance with that subsection.

Contracts.

22. A contract which is made between natural persons and would by law be —

- (a) required to be sealed shall be made, varied or discharged by the Corporation under seal;
- (b) required to be in writing signed by the parties thereto may be made, varied or discharged on behalf of the Corporation in writing signed by a person acting with its express or implied authority;
- (c) valid if although made by parol only may be made, varied or discharged by parol on behalf of the Corporation by any person acting with express or implied authority.

Sealing of documents.

23. (1) The common seal of the Corporation shall, when applied to a document, be attested by the Secretary and any member of the Corporation.

(2) The fact that a document bears the seal of the Corporation attested as provided in subsection (1) shall be prima facie evidence in any court or legal proceedings that the document has been properly executed on behalf of the Corporation.

No personal liability to  
attach to members or  
employees of the Corpor-  
ation.

24. No personal liability shall attach to any member or employee of the Corporation in respect of anything done in good faith, and without negligence under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Regulations.

25. The Civil Commissioner in Council may make regulations not inconsistent with this Ordinance for the better carrying out of the objects and purposes of this Ordinance.

### An Ordinance

To provide for exemptions from taxes, duties and levies.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, as follows —

**Citation.**

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Taxes and Duties (Special Exemptions) Ordinance 1983.

**Exemptions from taxes, duties or levies.**

2. (1) The Civil Commissioner acting on the advice of the Standing Finance Committee given under the hand of its Chairman, may exempt any person or association of persons from any tax, duty or levy provided for under any Ordinance.

(2) An exemption given under subsection (1) may be —

- (a) retrospective;
- (b) given for a specified period laid down by Standing Finance Committee;
- (c) given in respect of a specific item or transaction; or
- (d) may relate to the whole or part only of a tax, duty or levy.

**Restriction on Exemptions.**

3. No exemption may be given under this Ordinance to —

- (a) an ordinary resident of the Colony as defined in Section 2 of the Income Tax Ordinance Cap. 32;
- (b) a locally registered company; or
- (c) a body or association the majority of the members of which are ordinary residents of the Colony.

**Exemptions to be by Order.**

4. (1) An exemption shall be given by order published in the Gazette.

(2) An order given under subsection (1) shall contain such conditions as the Civil Commissioner acting on the advice of the Standing Finance Committee may impose.

The Civil Commissioner may cause to be issued out of the Public Revenue and other funds of the Colony and applied to the service of the period 1st July 1983 to 30th June 1984 a sum not exceeding Four million, eight hundred and twelve thousand, eight hundred and nineteen pounds, which sum is granted and shall be appropriated for the purposes and to defray the charges of the several services expressed and particularly mentioned in the Schedule hereto which will come in course of payment during the year 1983-84.

### An Ordinance

To provide for the dissolution of the Savings Bank and the transfer of deposits of money paid into the Savings Bank to the Standard Chartered Bank PLC on such dissolution.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands.

Citation and commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Savings Bank (Dissolution) Ordinance 1983 and shall come into force on the day of the Assent hereto.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires —
- “the Standard Chartered Bank” means the Standard Chartered Bank Public Limited Company;
  - “the Savings Bank” means the Savings Bank constituted and appointed under Section 3 of the Savings Bank Ordinance Cap. 61;
  - “Savings Bank Deposits” means all deposits of money paid into the Savings Bank pursuant to the Savings Bank Ordinance Cap. 61 and held by it on the Transfer Day together with all outstanding interest accrued up to the close of business on the day before Transfer Day;
  - “Savings Deposit Accounts” means accounts of that name maintained with the Standard Chartered Bank in accordance with its rules for the time being known as “Rules for Savings Deposit Accounts”;

"the Transfer Day" means the day appointed by the Civil Commissioner in accordance with Section 3.

3. On a day to be appointed by the Civil Commissioner by notice in the Gazette all Savings Bank deposits shall become transferred to the branch of the Standard Chartered Bank Public Limited Company established in Stanley.

Transfer of Savings Bank Deposits.

4. (1) All Savings Bank deposits that become transferred on the Transfer Day in accordance with Section 3 shall be held by the Standard Chartered Bank in savings deposit accounts until that bank otherwise agrees with or is otherwise instructed by the persons entitled to repayment of those deposits.

Transferred deposits to be held by Standard Chartered Bank in Savings Deposit Accounts.

(2) The Rules for Savings Deposit Accounts of the Standard Chartered Bank for the time being shall apply to the Savings Bank deposits referred to in subsection (1).

5. The Financial Secretary shall notify each depositor with the Savings Bank of interest accrued on his, her or their deposits up to the day before Transfer Day by either causing —

Notice of accrued interest.

- (a) a note of such interest to be made in the Savings Bank pass book of depositors; or
- (b) to be sent to depositors a notice declaring the amount of such interest within thirty days after the Transfer Day.

6. (1) On the Transfer Day the Financial Secretary shall pay to the Standard Chartered Bank such sum out of the assets of the Savings Bank either in Falkland Islands currency or Sterling currency or both such currencies as shall equal the total savings bank deposits transferred to the Standard Chartered Bank in accordance with Section 3.

Obligation of the Government to pay to the Standard Chartered Bank a sum equal to total Savings Bank Deposits.

(2) After making the payment referred to in Subsection (1) and meeting such expenses as may be incurred in relation to the dissolution of the Savings Bank the Financial Secretary shall transfer or cause to be transferred any surplus currency or other assets of the Savings Bank to or into the name of the Falkland Islands Government and this section shall constitute sufficient authority for such transfer.

7. On and after the Transfer Day the Standard Chartered Bank shall be liable to repay all Savings Bank deposits to those persons who shall be entitled in law to demand repayment thereof.

Obligation of Standard Chartered Bank to repay deposits.

8. The Standard Chartered Bank shall with effect from the Transfer Day be liable to pay interest in accordance with the current practice of that bank on the Savings Bank deposits transferred to it.

Payment of interest by the Standard Chartered Bank.

9. The Savings Bank shall stand dissolved on the Transfer Day.

Dissolution of Savings Bank.

10. (1) The Financial Secretary shall cause accounts to be prepared which shall show —

Dissolution accounts.

- (a) deposits received and repaid from the 1st day of July 1983 up to and including the day before Transfer Day;
- (b) interest credited to depositors during the period from the 1st day of July 1983 up to and including the day before Transfer Day;
- (c) a statement of the assets and liabilities of the Savings Bank on the day before Transfer Day;
- (d) a statement showing the sum transferred to the Standard Chartered Bank and the amount of currency or value of assets transferred to the Falkland Islands Government in accordance with Section 6.

(2) The Financial Secretary shall lay the accounts referred to in subsection (1) at its next meeting after the 31st December 1984 or at such meeting of the Legislative Council as the Civil Commissioner shall direct; whichever shall be the later.

(3) As soon as may be practicable after the accounts referred to in subsection (1) have been laid before the Legislative Council the Financial Secretary shall cause them to be published in the Gazette and shall submit them to the Secretary of State.

**Confidentiality.**

11. No person shall disclose, except for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the provisions of this Ordinance, the name of any depositor with or the amounts deposited with or withdrawn from the Savings Bank.

**Repeal of Savings Bank Ordinance.**

12. The Savings Bank Ordinance Cap. 61 shall be repealed with effect from the Transfer Day.

**Income Tax (Annual Values) Rules 1983**

(Under sections 5 (b) (ii) and 5 (c) of the Ordinance)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by sections 5 (b) (ii) and 5 (c) of the Income Tax Ordinance, the Civil Commissioner in Council has made the following rules —

Citation and commencement.

1. (1) These rules may be cited as the Income Tax (Annual Values) Rules 1983.

(2) The provisions of these Rules shall have effect with respect to tax chargeable for the year of assessment commencing on the 1st day of January 1983 and for all subsequent years of assessment.

Allowances.

2. For the purposes of prescribing the annual value of any allowance in respect of employment received otherwise than in money, the following shall be deemed to be chargeable income under section 5 (b) (ii) of the Income Tax Ordinance —

- (a) the estimated value of any light, power or fuel supplied free of charge by an employer;
- (b) the value of any board, lodging or board and lodging where it is fully and continuously provided during any period of employment, and where the recipient maintains no other fixed place of abode in the Colony while so employed.

Values.

3. The following values are hereby prescribed for the purposes of sections 5 (b) (ii) and 5 (c) of the Income Tax Ordinance —

(1) A new coin of cupro-nickel of the denomination of twenty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 5 grammes, a standard diameter of 21·4 millimetres and a standard composition of eighty-four per centum copper and sixteen per centum nickel and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.

(2) In the making of the said coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0·03 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0·125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.

3. The design for the said coin shall be as follows —

- (a) For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND".
- (b) For the reverse a sheep taken from the Coat of Arms of Our Colony and the year to the right with the inscription "FALKLAND ISLANDS" at the bottom and the figure "20" above.
- (c) The coin shall have a plain edge.

4. The coin shall be current within Our Colony of the Falkland Islands.

2. (1) The following new coins, being coins of a standard weight of 28·2759 grammes, a standard diameter of 38·608 millimetres and a circular shape, shall be made —

- (a) a silver coin of a millesimal fineness 925; and
- (b) a cupro-nickel coin of a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel.

(2) In the making of the said silver coin prescribed by section 2 (1) (a) of this Our Proclamation a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0·1296 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0·125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard composition of millesimal fineness of 5.

(3) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin prescribed by section 2 (1) (b) of this Our Proclamation a remedy shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0·1296 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0·125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.

3. The design for the said coins shall be as follows —

- (a) For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription “QUEEN ELIZABETH II” to the left of the portrait with “FALKLAND ISLANDS” to the right and at the bottom “50 PENCE”.
- (b) For the reverse impression a representation of the ship *Desire* with the date 1833 on the left and the date 1983 on the right and the inscription “FALKLAND” at the top and “ISLANDS” at the bottom.
- (c) Every coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

4. The said coins shall be current within Our Colony of the Falkland Islands.

3. Any person who contravenes regulation 2 shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of £100 or imprisonment for six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

PENSIONS (UNESTABLISHED LOCALLY RECRUITED GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES)  
ORDINANCE 1979

**Pensions (Unestablished Locally Recruited Government Employees)  
REGULATIONS 1984**

No. 1 of 1984.

In accordance with Section 4 of the Pensions (Unestablished Locally Recruited Government Employees) Ordinance 1979 the Civil Commissioner in Council makes the following regulations—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Pensions (Unestablished Locally Recruited Government Employees) Regulations 1984 and shall have effect from the 1st day of January 1978.

Citation.

2. In these regulations —

Interpretation.

“employee” means an unestablished locally recruited Government employee;

“wage” means the basic wage at the date of the employee's retirement and does not include any other allowance.

3. Subject to these regulations a pension may be granted to an employee on retirement from service with the Government for ten or more years if being female the employee has attained sixty years and being male has attained sixty five years of age.

To whom pension may be granted.

4. (1) Subject to paragraph (3) a pension payable to an employee under Regulation 3 shall be at the rate of one eightieth of his wage in respect of each completed year of pensionable service.

Amount of Pension.

(2) A pension granted to an employee under this regulation shall not exceed forty eightieths of his wage.

(3) The Civil Commissioner in Council may increase the amount of the pension from time to time.

5. Periods during which an employee has been absent from work on leave without wages shall not be taken into account for calculating length of service without the approval of the Civil Commissioner in Council.

Leave without wages.

6. There shall not be taken into account as pensionable service any period of service while the employee was eligible for gratuity under a separate agreement or contract with the Government.

Service not taken into account as pensionable.

7. (1) Only continuous service up to the day of retirement shall be taken into account for the purposes of Regulation 3.

Service to be continuous.

(2) Temporary breaks in service on account of leave or sickness shall be disregarded for the purpose of deciding whether service is continuous.

(3) The decision of the Financial Secretary as to whether or not a break in service is temporary for the purposes of this regulation shall be final.

8. (1) Where an employee retires from service with the Government after serving for not less than five years he may be granted by the Civil Commissioner in Council a gratuity at the rate herein specified for each complete year of service, that is to say —

Gratuities.

(a) for each of the first five years, one week's wages;

(b) for each of the next five years, two weeks' wages;

(c) for each additional year, five weeks' wages:

Provided that the total amount of the gratuity shall not exceed the amount of two years' wages.

(2) A gratuity payable under this regulation may be granted in addition to any pension that may be granted under Regulation 3.

Pension or gratuity not of right.

9. (1) No employee shall have an absolute right to a pension or gratuity.

(2) Where it is established to the satisfaction of the Civil Commissioner in Council that an employee has been guilty of negligence, irregularity or misconduct, the pension or gratuity may be reduced or disallowed.

Pension payable to widow.

10. On the death of a male pensioner who leaves a widow the widow shall be entitled to one half of his pension until her remarriage or death.

Pensions or gratuities not to be assignable.

11. A pension or gratuity granted under these regulations shall not be assignable or transferable except for the purpose of satisfying -

- (a) a debt due to the Government; or
- (b) an order of a competent court for the payment of periodical sums of money towards the maintenance of the wife or former wife or minor child of the person to whom the pension or gratuity has been granted;

and shall not be liable to be attached, sequestered or levied upon for or in respect of any debt or claim whatever except a debt due to the Government as aforesaid.

### An Ordinance

To control the subdivision of land for acquisition  
by persons not resident in the Falkland Islands.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland  
Islands, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Land (Subdivision for  
non-residents) Ordinance 1985 and shall come into force on the 21st  
day of January 1985.

Citation and commence-  
ment.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires —  
“acquire” shall mean take a conveyance, lease, letting or grant  
of right of occupation or use, whether for a consideration or  
not;

Interpretation.

“the controlled area” shall mean all that area of land outside a  
radius of six miles from the Cathedral in Stanley except such  
part or parts of such area as are exempted from the provisions  
of this Ordinance in accordance with Section 8;

“licence” shall mean a licence referred to in Section 3 (1);

“non-resident” shall mean a person who has not immediately  
preceding an application for a licence under Section 5 been  
ordinarily resident in the Falkland Islands for a period of three  
years;

a person shall be considered to have been ordinarily resident in  
the Falkland Islands for the said period of three years provided  
that after the commencement of that period such person has  
not been absent from the Falkland Islands for more than 120  
days.

Licence for acquisition of land in a controlled area.

3. (1) No non-resident shall acquire land in the controlled area being of 500 acres or less without a licence issued by the Civil Commissioner in Council.

(2) A licence may be issued for a fixed period but may be renewed if application is made before its expiry date.

Licence conditions.

4. (1) A licence may be issued subject to such conditions as the Civil Commissioner in Council may in his discretion impose.

(2) Without derogating from the generality of subsection (1) conditions imposed in respect of a licence may provide for —

- (a) drainage;
- (b) building lines;
- (c) access and other roads, their standard and minimum width;
- (d) the provision and siting of electricity, water and other services;
- (e) the making over to the Crown free of charge of any roads to be constructed on such land which are likely to be used as public rights of way;
- (f) the siting of buildings;
- (g) where the licence is in respect of plots for building residential accommodation the reservation of land for schools, churches, shops and land for commercial or industrial use.

Form of application and information required.

5. (1) An application for a licence shall be made in writing in the prescribed form.

(2) An application shall be accompanied by such information and documents as may be prescribed or the Civil Commissioner shall in his discretion require.

Acquisition of land without licence void.

6. A document purporting to provide for the acquisition of land for which a licence is required but has not been granted shall be void and of no effect.

Registrar General not to register document conveyance letting or grant without licence.

7. The Registrar General shall not register any document, conveyance, lease, letting or grant of land to which Section 3 shall apply unless it is accompanied by an unexpired licence.

Exemptions.

8. The Civil Commissioner may by Order in Council exempt any part or parts of the controlled area from the provisions of this Ordinance.

Offences.

9. (1) Any person who shall —

- (a) knowingly supply false information in an application for a licence or in support of such application; or
- (b) attempt without a licence to acquire land for which a licence may be required; or
- (c) fail to comply with a condition of a licence; or
- (d) contravene this Ordinance;

shall commit an offence.

(2) Any person who commits an offence under this Ordinance shall on conviction be liable to a fine of £2000 or to imprisonment for two years or both.

Regulations.

10. The Civil Commissioner may by Order in Council make regulations for anything that may be prescribed under Section 5 and otherwise for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance.

(a) under the age when he is required by law to attend school in the Falkland Islands;

(b) required by law to attend school in the Falkland Islands; or

(c) subject to subsection (2), being unmarried, receiving full time instruction at any university, college, school or other educational establishment whether in the Falkland Islands or not.

(2) A person to whom subsection 1 (c) applies shall not be a child for the purposes of this Ordinance if —

- (a) he is over such age as may be declared by the Civil Commissioner by Order in Council; or
- (b) his income in his own right, excluding the amount of any scholarship, bursary or the like, exceeds the sum deductible under Section 15 (4) of the Income Tax Ordinance or any enactment substituted therefor." Cap. 32.
- (c) the insertion in Section 17 (3) after the words "temporary absence of a person therefrom" of the following —  
 "or, in the case of a child, absence therefrom to undergo full time instruction at any university, college, school or other educational establishment".

(3) An Order made under subsection (1) shall be lawful if it fixes a minimum wage for occupations in general.

(4) An Order made under subsection (1) may except certain occupations or classes of persons within an occupation from such Order."

- (b) on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which his parent belongs.

(3) In this section the expression "leave" means leave granted by any person authorised in that behalf by the Superintendent either specifically or generally."

- (c) in Section 15 by the substitution for "five pounds", "twenty-five pounds" and "fifty pounds" of "twenty-five pounds", "one hundred and twenty-five pounds" and "two hundred and fifty pounds" respectively.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance 1985 and shall come into force on such day as the Civil Commissioner shall declare by Order published in the Gazette.

Citation and commencement.

2. The Road Traffic Ordinance Cap 60 is amended by —

Amendment of Cap. 60.

- (a) (i) the removal of the full stop at the end of the definition of "Drivers Licence" in Section 2 and the addition of the following to that definition —

"and such other licence as may be recognised under the provisions of this Ordinance or Regulations made hereunder as permitting a person to drive a motor vehicle.";

- (ii) the deletion of the words "the Stanley to Darwin Road" from the definition of "Road" in the same section and the substitution for those words of the following —

"any other street, thoroughfare, highway, lane, court, alley, passage or open place declared by the Civil Commissioner by Order in Council to be a road for the purposes of this Ordinance.";

- (b) the repeal of subsections (4), (5), (6) and (7) of Section 3;  
(c) the repeal of subsections (3A) and (3B) of Section 5;  
(d) the substitution in Section 6 (1) of the words "such risks as may be prescribed" for the words "third party risks";

(e) the substitution for Section 8 (3) of the following —

“(3) drives a motor vehicle,

- (a) on a road within the boundaries of Stanley or on any other road designated by the Civil Commissioner by Order in Council as an urban road at a speed greater than twenty-five miles an hour, or
- (b) on any other road designated by the Civil Commissioner in Council as a restricted road at a speed greater than forty miles an hour or greater than such lower speed as the Civil Commissioner may by Order in Council prescribe for that road;

(f) the repeal of Section 8 (5);

(g) the repeal of Section 16;

(h) the substitution of the following section for Section 18 thereof —

“Regulations.

18. (1) The Civil Commissioner by Order in Council may make Regulations providing for —

- (a) the registration of motor vehicles and the division of vehicles into classes for that purpose;
- (b) the exemption from registration, conditional or otherwise, of any vehicle or class of vehicle;
- (c) the display on vehicles of —
  - (i) prescribed identification marks,
  - (ii) vehicle licences,
  - (iii) any other means of identification of vehicles or the owners thereof;
- (d) controlling restricting or specifying —
  - (i) the colours of motor vehicles or any specified class thereof, and
  - (ii) special markings to be displayed or carried on motor vehicles or on any class of motor vehicle;
- (e) the licensing of drivers of motor vehicles;
- (f) the classes of motor vehicles for which persons may be licensed to drive;
- (g) the grant of temporary and provisional licences to drive;
- (h) the testing of persons applying for or holding driving licences;
- (i) the specification of any countries the holders of driving licences or driver's certificates of which are exempt from the requirements to take a test;
- (j) controlling or restricting traffic, whether vehicular or pedestrian, including the imposition of one way traffic systems;
- (k) controlling the driving of motor vehicles and the use of motor vehicles, their equipment and apparatus, including the testing, inspection and weighing thereof for the purpose of ascertaining whether there is or has been a contravention of any provision of this Ordinance;
- (l) controlling the conduct of persons using motor vehicles and drivers, conductors and passengers including intending passengers on motor vehicles;

- (m) controlling the user of roads and in particular prohibiting either absolutely or during specified hours in the day —
  - (i) the driving of any specified type or class of motor vehicle on a road,
  - (ii) the manner in which a motor vehicle of any specified type or class may be used on a road, or
  - (iii) the parking of motor vehicles on a road;
- (n) the arrest of persons who commit offences under this Ordinance;
- (o) controlling charges for the hire of motor vehicles and fares payable by passengers carried therein;
- (p) restricting the number of passengers who may be carried in or on any motor vehicle;
- (q) the granting and cancellation by the Chief Police Officer of permits authorising the use of public service vehicles and other motor vehicles for the carriage of passengers for hire or reward;
- (r) the designation of car parks and their administration;
- (s) the removal from roads, car parks and parking places of motor vehicles, without notice to the owners thereof, which contravene any provision of this Ordinance, and the fees payable in respect of such removal;
- (t) the seizure, impounding and detention for a period not exceeding 2 months of any motor vehicle which has been driven or used in contravention of this Ordinance;
- (u) the disposal by way of sale or otherwise or the destruction of unclaimed motor vehicles which have been seized, impounded or detained pursuant to regulations made under this section;
- (v) road signs and markings and including the observance thereof;
- (w) forms and other documents;
- (x) fees payable for any licence or on any application made under this Ordinance or Regulations made thereunder;
- (y) risks against which insurance shall be taken out;
- (z) the general carrying into effect of the provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) Any regulations made under subsection (1) may provide that contravention thereof shall be an offence and may provide a penalty thereof not exceeding a fine of £1000 or imprisonment for six months or both.”.

- (c) any other purpose specified as public by any Ordinance or which the Civil Commissioner in Council may declare to be a public purpose."
- (b) in Section 35 (2) by the substitution of the sum £1,000 for the sum £50;
- (c) the deletion of the certificate as to value in the First Schedule;
- (d) the substitution in the Third Schedule for the part headed CONVEYANCE of the following —

### An Ordinance

To provide for the formation and regulation  
of Co-operative Societies.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland  
Islands.

#### PART 1

#### PRELIMINARY

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Co-operative Societies Ordinance and shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1986. Citation and commencement.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires — Interpretation.

“bonus” means a share of the profits of a registered society divided among its members in proportion to the amount of business done with the society by them from which the profits of the society were derived;

“by-laws” means the registered by-laws made by a society in the exercise of any power conferred by this Ordinance, and includes registered amendments thereto;

“committee” means the governing body of a registered society to whom the management of its affairs is entrusted;

“dividend” means a share of the profits of a registered society divided among its members in proportion to the share capital held by them;

“member” includes a person or registered society joining in the application for the registration of a society and a person or registered society admitted to membership after registration in accordance with the by-laws;

“officer” includes a chairman, secretary, treasurer, member of committee, or other person empowered under the rules or by-laws to give directions concerning the business of a registered society;

“registered society” means a co-operative society registered under this Ordinance;

“Registrar” means the Registrar of co-operative societies appointed under Section 3 and includes a person when exercising such of the powers of the Registrar as may have been conferred upon him under that section;

“rules” means rules made under this Ordinance.

## PART 2

### REGISTRATION

Appointment of Registrar of Co-operative Societies and assistant registrars.

3. The Governor may appoint a person to be Registrar of Co-operative Societies for the Falkland Islands and may appoint persons to assist such Registrar, and may by notice published in the Gazette confer on any such persons all or any of the powers of the Registrar under this Ordinance.

Societies that may be registered.

4. (1) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a society which has as its object the promotion of the economic interests of its members in accordance with co-operative principles, or a society established with the object of facilitating the operations of such a society, may be registered under this Ordinance with or without limited liability as the Registrar may decide.

(2) The liability of a society which includes at least one registered society among its members shall be limited.

Conditions of registration.

5. (1) No society, other than a society of which a member is a registered society, shall be registered under this Ordinance, which does not consist of at least ten persons each of whom is qualified under Section 21 for membership.

(2) The word “co-operative” shall form part of the name of every registered society.

(3) The word “limited” shall be the last word in the name of every society registered with limited liability under this Ordinance.

(4) When for the purposes of this section any question arises as to age, residence or occupation of land constituting the qualification of any person that question shall be decided by the Registrar whose decision shall be final.

Application by a society for registration.

6. (1) A society which desires to be registered under this Ordinance shall make application to the Registrar.

(2) The application shall be signed —

(a) in the case of a society of which no member is a registered society, by at least ten persons qualified in accordance with the requirements of Section 21; and

(b) in the case of a society of which a member is a registered society, by a duly authorised person on behalf of every such registered society, and, where all the members of the society are not registered societies, by ten other members, or, when there are less than ten other members, by all of them.

(3) The application shall be accompanied by copies of the proposed by-laws of the society, and such other information with regard to the society as the Registrar may require.

Registration and appeal from refusal to register.

7. (1) If the Registrar is satisfied that a society has complied with the provisions of this Ordinance and the rules, and that its proposed by-laws are not contrary to this Ordinance or to the rules, he may, if he considers fit, register the society and its by-laws. An appeal shall lie to the Governor in Council against the refusal of the Registrar to register any society within one month from the date of such refusal.

(2) On registration the society shall pay such fee as may be required by the rules.

8. Upon registration a society shall become a body corporate by the name under which it is registered with perpetual succession and with power to hold property, to enter into contracts, to institute and defend suits and other legal proceedings, and to do all things necessary for the purpose of its constitution.

Society to become body corporate upon registration.

9. A certificate of registration signed by the Registrar shall be conclusive evidence that the society therein mentioned is duly registered, unless it is proved that the registration of the society has been cancelled.

Evidence of registration.

### PART 3

#### DUTIES AND PRIVILEGES OF SOCIETIES

10. (1) Any registered society may, subject to this Ordinance and the rules, amend its by-laws, including the by-law which declares the name of the society.

Amendment of by-laws of a registered society.

(2) No amendment of the by-laws of a registered society shall be valid until that amendment has been registered under this Ordinance, for which purpose copies of the amendment shall be forwarded to the Registrar.

(3) If the Registrar is satisfied that an amendment of the by-laws of a registered society is not contrary to this Ordinance or to the rules he may, if he thinks fit, register the amendment. An appeal shall lie to the Governor in Council against the refusal of the Registrar to register any amendment of any by-law.

(4) An amendment which changes the name of a society shall not affect any right or obligation of the society or of any of its members or past members, and any legal proceedings pending may be continued by or against the society under its new name.

(5) When the Registrar registers an amendment of the by-laws of a registered society he shall issue to that society a copy of the amendment certified by him which shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the amendment has been duly registered.

11. Every registered society shall have an address, registered in accordance with the rules, to which all notices and communications may be sent, and shall send to the Registrar notice of every change of that address.

Address of society.

12. Every registered society shall keep a copy of this Ordinance and of the rules and of its by-laws and a list of its members open to inspection, free of charge, at all reasonable times at the registered address of the society.

Copy of Ordinance, rules and by-laws to be open to inspection.

13. (1) A registered society which has as one of its objects the disposal of any article produced or obtained by the work or industry of its members, whether the produce of agriculture, animal husbandry, forestry, fisheries, handicrafts or otherwise, may provide in its by-laws or may otherwise contract with its members —

Disposal of produce to or through a registered society.

- (a) that every member who produces such article shall dispose of the whole or any specified amount, proportion or description thereof to or through the society; and
- (b) that any member who is proved or adjudged in such manner as may be prescribed by the rules to be guilty of a breach of such by-laws or contract shall pay to the society as liquidated damages a sum ascertained or assessed in the manner prescribed by the by-laws.

(2) No contract entered into under the provisions of this section shall be contested in any court on the ground only that it constitutes a contract in restraint of trade.

Creation of charge in favour of registered society.

14. (1) Subject to any prior claim of the Crown on the property of the debtor and to the lien or claim of a landlord in respect of rent or any money recoverable as rent and in the case of immovable property to any prior registered charge thereon —

- (a) any debt or outstanding demand payable to a registered society by any member or past member shall be a first charge on all crops or other agricultural produce, felled timber or other forest produce, marine produce, fish (fresh-water and salt-water), livestock, fodder, agricultural, industrial and fishing implements, plant, machinery, boats, tackle and nets, raw materials, stock in trade and generally all produce of labour and things used in connection with production raised, purchased or produced in whole or in part from any loan whether in money or in goods given to him by the society:

Provided that nothing therein contained shall affect the claim of any bona fide purchaser or transferee without notice;

- (b) any outstanding demands or dues payable to a registered housing society by any member or past member in respect of rent, shares, loans or purchase money or any other rights or amounts payable to such society shall be a first charge upon his interest in the immovable property of the society.

Charge and set off in respect of shares or interest of member or past member.

15. A registered society shall have a charge upon the shares or interest in the capital and on the deposits of a member or past member or deceased member and upon any dividend, bonus, or profits payable to a member or past member or to the estate of a deceased member in respect of any debt due to the society from such member or past member or estate, and may set off any sum credited or payable to a member or past member or the estate of a deceased member in or towards payment of any such debt.

Share or interest not liable to attachment or sale.

16. Subject to Section 15, the share or interest of a member in the capital of a registered society shall not be liable to attachment or sale under any decree or order of a court in respect of any debt or liability incurred by such member, and neither his assignee in insolvency nor a receiver duly appointed shall be entitled to, or have any claim on, such share or interest.

Transfer of share or interest on death of member.

17. (1) On the death of a member, a registered society may transfer the share or interest of the deceased member to the person nominated in accordance with the rules made in that behalf or, if there is no person so nominated, to such person as may appear to the committee to be the heir or legal representative of the deceased member or may pay to such nominee, heir or legal representative, as the case may be, a sum representing the value of such member's share or interest, as ascertained, in accordance with the rules or by-laws:

Provided that —

- (a) in the case of a society with unlimited liability, such nominee, heir or legal representative, as the case may be, may require payment by the society of the value of the share or interest of the deceased member ascertained as aforesaid;
- (b) in the case of a society with limited liability, the society may transfer the share or interest of the deceased member to such nominee, heir or legal representative, as the case

may be, being qualified in accordance with the rules and by-laws for membership of the society, or on his application within six months of the death of the deceased member to any person specified in the application who is so qualified.

(2) A registered society shall pay all other moneys due to the deceased member from the society to such nominee, heir or legal representative, as the case may be.

(3) All transfers and payments made by a registered society in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be valid and effectual against any demand made upon the society by any other person.

18. (1) A registered society may receive deposits from or for the benefit of minors and it shall be lawful for a registered society to pay such minors the interest which may become due on such deposits. Any deposits made by a minor may, together with the interest accrued thereon, be paid to that minor; and any deposit made on behalf of a minor may, together with the interest accrued thereon, be paid to the guardian of that minor for the use of the minor.

Deposits by or on behalf of minors.

(2) The receipt of any minor or guardian for money paid to him under this section shall be a sufficient discharge of the liability of the society in respect of that money.

19. Any register or list of members kept by any registered society shall be prima facie evidence of any of the following particulars entered therein —

Register or list of members.

- (a) the date at which the name of any person was entered in such register or list as a member;
- (b) the date at which any such person ceased to be a member.

20. (1) A copy of any entry in a book of a registered society regularly kept in the course of business shall, if certified in such manner as may be prescribed by the rules, be received in any legal proceeding, civil or criminal, as prima facie evidence of the existence of such entry and shall be admitted as evidence of the matter, transactions and accounts therein recorded in every case where, and to the same extent as, the original entry itself is admissible.

Proof of entry in book of registered society.

(2) No officer of any such society shall, in any legal proceedings to which the society is not a party, be compelled to produce any of the society's books, the contents of which can be proved under subsection (1) or to appear as a witness to prove any matters, transactions or accounts therein recorded, unless the court for special reason so directs.

#### PART 4

##### RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES OF MEMBERS

21. In order to be qualified for membership of a registered society, a person, other than a registered society, must —

Qualifications for membership of registered society.

- (a) have attained the age of 18 years;
- (b) be resident within or in occupation of land within the society's area of operation as described by the by-laws.

22. No member of a registered society shall exercise the rights of a member unless or until he has made such payment to the society in respect of membership or acquired such interest in the society, as may be prescribed by the rules or by-laws.

No member to exercise rights until prescribed payment made or interest acquired.

23. Except with the sanction of the Registrar, no person shall be a member of more than one registered society whose primary object is to grant loans to its members.

Restriction of membership of loan societies.

**Votes of members.**

24. No member of any registered society shall have more than one vote in the conduct of the affairs of the society:

Provided that —

- (a) in the case of an equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote;
- (b) in the case of societies of which a registered society is a member that society may have such voting powers as are provided in the rules.

**Voting for registered society by proxy.**

25. A registered society which is a member of any other registered society may appoint any one of its members as its proxy for the purpose of voting in the conduct of the affairs of such other registered society.

**Acts and contracts of members who are minors.**

26. The minority of any member of a registered society shall not debar that person from executing any instrument or giving any acquittance necessary to be executed or given under this Ordinance or the rules made hereunder, and shall not be a ground for invalidating or avoiding any contract entered into by any such person with the society; and any such contract entered into by any such person with the society, whether as principal or as surety, shall be enforceable at law or against such person notwithstanding his minority.

**Limit on ownership of share capital.**

27. No member, other than a registered society, shall hold more than one-fifth of the share capital of any registered society.

**Conditions and restrictions on transfer or charge of share or interest.**

28. (1) The transfer or charge of the share or interest of a member or past member or deceased member in the capital of a registered society shall be subject to such conditions as to maximum holding as may be prescribed by this Ordinance or by the rules.

(2) In the case of a society registered with unlimited liability, a member shall not transfer any share held by him or his interest in the capital of the society or any part thereof, unless —

- (a) he has held such share or interest for not less than one year; and
- (b) the transfer or charge is made to the society, or to a member of the society, or to a person whose application for membership has been accepted by the committee.

**Liability of past member and estate of deceased member for debts of society.**

29. (1) The liability of a past member for the debts of a registered society as they existed on the date on which he ceased to be a member shall not continue for a period of more than two years reckoned from that date.

(2) The estate of a deceased member shall not be liable for the debts of a registered society as they existed on the date of his death for a period that is longer than the liability of his estate for any other debt.

**PART 5****PROPERTY AND FUNDS OF REGISTERED SOCIETIES****Restriction on loans by registered society.**

30. (1) A registered society shall not, except as provided in Section 33, make any loan to any person other than a member.

(2) Except with the permission of the Registrar a registered society shall not lend money on the security of any movable property other than produce or goods in which the society is authorised to deal.

(3) The Governor may by Order prohibit or restrict the lending of money on mortgage of any description of immovable property of any registered society.

31. A registered society shall receive deposits and loans from persons who are not members only to such extent and under such conditions as may be prescribed by the rules or by-laws.

Deposits and loans received by registered society.

32. Save as provided in Sections 30 and 31, the transactions of a registered society with persons other than members shall be subject to such prohibitions and restrictions as may be prescribed by the rules.

Transactions of registered society with non-members.

33. A registered society may invest or deposit its funds —

Investment or deposit of funds of registered society.

- (a) in a savings bank, or with any bank or person carrying on the business of banking approved for this purpose by the Registrar; or
- (b) in any securities issued or guaranteed by a Government within the Commonwealth; or
- (c) with any other registered society approved for this purpose by the Registrar; or
- (d) in any other mode allowed by the rules.

34. (1) The Financial Secretary shall from time to time prescribe by Order in the Gazette the fraction of the net profits of every registered society, as ascertained by the audit prescribed by Section 35, that shall be carried to a fund to be called the reserve fund, which shall be employed as prescribed by the rules. After deduction of any tax which may have been charged on a registered society in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Ordinance, the remainder of such profits and any profits of past years available for distribution may be divided among the members by way of dividend or bonus, or allocated to any funds constituted by the society, to such extent or under such conditions as may be prescribed by the rules or by-laws:

Disposal of profits.

Provided that, in the case of a society with unlimited liability, no distribution of profits shall be made except by authority given by the Governor by Order in Council.

(2) Any registered society may, with the sanction of the Registrar, after the fraction of the net profits provided for in subsection (1) has been carried to a reserve fund, contribute an amount not exceeding ten per cent of the remaining net profits to any charitable purpose or to a common-good fund.

## PART 6.

### AUDIT, INSPECTION AND INQUIRY

35. (1) The Registrar shall audit or cause to be audited by some person authorised by him in writing the accounts of every registered society once at least in every year.

Audit.

(2) The audit under subsection (1) shall include an examination of overdue debts, if any, and a valuation of the assets and liabilities of the registered society.

(3) The Registrar and every other person appointed to audit the accounts of a society shall have power when necessary —

- (a) to summon at the time of his audit any officer, agent, servant or member of the society who he has reason to believe can give material information about any transactions of the society or the management of its affairs; or
- (b) to require the production of any book or document relating to the affairs of, or any cash or securities belonging to the society by the officer, agent, servant or member in possession of such book or document, cash or securities.

Registrar to have access to books, accounts, papers and securities of registered society.

36. The Registrar, or any person authorised in writing by the Registrar, shall at all times have access to all the books, accounts, papers and securities of a registered society, and shall be entitled to inspect the cash in hand; and every officer of the society shall furnish such information concerning the transactions and working of the society as the person making such inspection may require.

Inquiry and inspection.

37. (1) The Registrar may of his own motion, and shall on the application of a majority of the committee, or of not less than one-third of the members of a registered society, hold an inquiry or direct that some person appointed by him by order in writing published in the Gazette, hold an inquiry into the constitution, working, and financial condition of a registered society; and all officers and members of the society shall furnish such information concerning the affairs of the society and produce the cash in hand and such books, accounts, papers and securities of the society as the Registrar or the person appointed by him may require.

(2) The Registrar shall, on the application of a creditor of a registered society, inspect or direct that some person appointed by him in writing inspect the books of the society, if the applicant —

- (a) proves that an ascertained sum of money is then due to him and that he has demanded payment thereof and has not received satisfaction within a reasonable time; and
- (b) deposits with the Registrar such sum as security for the costs of the proposed inspection as the Registrar may require.

(3) The Registrar shall communicate the results of any such inspection to the creditor and to the society into whose affairs inquiry has been made.

(4) Where an inquiry is held under subsection (1) or an inspection is made under subsection (2) the Registrar may apportion the costs or such part of the costs, as he may consider right between the registered society, the members demanding an inquiry, the officers or former officers of the society, and the creditor, if any, on whose application the inquiry was made.

(5) Any sum awarded by way of costs against any society or person under this section may be recovered on application to the Magistrate's Court in like manner as a fine imposed by such court.

## PART 7

### DISSOLUTION

Dissolution.

38. (1) If the Registrar, after holding an inquiry or making an inspection under Section 37 or on receipt of an application made by three-fourths of the members of a registered society, is of opinion that the society ought to be dissolved, he may make an order for the cancellation of the registration of the society.

(2) Any member of a registered society may, within two months from the date of an order under subsection (1), appeal from such order to the Governor in Council.

(3) Where no appeal is presented within two months from the making of an order cancelling the registration of a society, the order shall take effect on the expiry of that period. Where an appeal is presented within two months, the order shall not take effect until it is confirmed.

(4) Where the Registrar makes an order for the cancellation of the registration of a society under subsection (1) he may make such further order as he may think fit for the custody of the books and documents and the protection of the assets of the society until the order cancelling registration takes effect.

(5) No registered society shall be wound up save by an order of the Registrar.

39. The Registrar may, by order in writing, cancel the registration of any registered society other than a society which includes among its members one or more registered societies, if at any time it is proved to his satisfaction that the number of the members has been reduced to less than ten. Every such order shall take effect from the date thereof.

Cancellation of registration for lack of membership.

40. Where the registration of a society is cancelled by an order under Section 38 or 39 the society shall cease to exist as a corporate body from the date on which the order takes effect, hereinafter referred to as the date of dissolution:

Effect of cancellation of registration.

Provided that any privileges conferred on the society by or under Sections 14, 15, 16 and 17 shall be deemed to be vested in any liquidator appointed for the society by the Registrar.

41. Where the registration of a society is cancelled under Sections 38 and 39 the Registrar may appoint one or more persons to be, subject to his direction and control, the liquidator or liquidators of the society.

Appointment of liquidators.

42. (1) A liquidator appointed under Section 41 shall, subject to the guidance and control of the Registrar and to any limitations imposed by the Registrar by order under Section 43, have power to —

Powers of liquidator.

- (a) determine from time to time the contribution to be made by members and past members or by the estate of deceased members of the society to its assets;
- (b) appoint a day by notice before which creditors whose claims are not already recorded in the books of the society shall state their claims for admission or to be excluded from any distribution made before they have proved them;
- (c) decide any question of priority which arises between creditors;
- (d) refer disputes to arbitration and institute and defend suits and other legal proceedings on behalf of the society by his name or office;
- (e) decide by what persons and in what proportions the costs of liquidation are to be borne;
- (f) give such directions concerning the collection and distribution of assets as may be necessary in the course of winding up the society;
- (g) compromise any claim by or against the society provided that the sanction of the Registrar has first been obtained;
- (h) call such general meetings of members as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the liquidation;
- (i) take possession of the books, documents and assets of the society;
- (j) sell the property of the society;
- (k) carry on the business of the society so far as may be necessary for winding it up beneficially;

Provided the liquidator of a credit society may not issue any loan; and

- (l) arrange for the distribution of the assets of the society in a convenient manner after a scheme of distribution has been approved by the Registrar.

(2) Subject to the rules, any liquidator appointed under this Ordinance shall so far as such powers are necessary for carrying out the purposes of this section have power to summon and enforce the

attendance of persons and witnesses and to compel the production of documents by the same means in the manner as is provided in the case of a senior magistrate.

**Powers of Registrar to control liquidation.**

43. A liquidator shall exercise his powers subject to the control and revision of the Registrar who may —

- (a) rescind or vary any order made by a liquidator and make whatever new order is required;
- (b) call for all books, documents and assets of the society;
- (c) remove a liquidator from office;
- (d) by order in writing limit the powers of a liquidator under Section 42;
- (e) require accounts to be rendered to him by the liquidator;
- (f) procure the auditing of the liquidator's accounts and authorise the distribution of the assets of the society;
- (g) make an order for the remuneration of the liquidator; or
- (h) refer any dispute between a liquidator and a third party to arbitration if that party shall have consented in writing to be bound by the decision of the arbitrator.

**Enforcement of decision of arbitrator and order by liquidator or Registrar.**

44. (1) The decision of an arbitrator on any matter referred to him under Section 43 shall be binding upon the parties and shall be enforceable in like manner as an order made by the Registrar under that section.

(2) An order made by a liquidator or by the Registrar under Section 42 or 43 shall be enforced by the Senior Magistrate's court in like manner as a decree of that court.

**Limitation of jurisdiction of the civil court.**

45. Save as is hereinbefore expressly provided no court shall have any jurisdiction in respect of any matter concerned with the dissolution of a registered society under this Ordinance.

**Application of funds on liquidation and closing of liquidation.**

46. (1) In the liquidation of a society whose registration has been cancelled, the funds, including the reserve fund, shall be applied first to the costs of liquidation, then to the discharge of the liabilities of the society, then to the payment of the share capital and then, provided the by-laws of the society permit, to the payment of a dividend at a rate not exceeding ten per cent per annum for any period for which no disposal of profits was made.

(2) When the liquidation of a society has been closed and any creditor of the society has not claimed or received what is due to him under the scheme of distribution, notice of the closing of the liquidation shall be published in the Gazette; and all claims against the funds of the society liquidated shall be void when two years have elapsed from the date of publication of the Gazette notice.

(3) Any surplus remaining after the application of the funds to the purposes specified in subsection (1) and the payment of any claims for which an action is instituted under subsection (2) shall be available for distribution to members who have done business with the society during any part of the preceding ten financial years and the broken period prior to the dissolution in accordance with a scheme approved by the Registrar but under which the share of the distribution to be received by each member shall so far as may be practicable be calculated in relation to the amount of money invested with the society by that member and the amount of profits earned by the society on that member's business during the said period.

## PART 8

## SURCHARGE AND ATTACHMENT

47. (1) Where, in the course of the winding up of a registered society, it appears that any person who has taken part in the organisation or management of such society or any past or present officer of the society has misapplied or retained or become liable or accountable for any money or property of such society or has been guilty of misfeasance or breach of trust in relation to such society, the Registrar may, on the application of the liquidator or of any creditor or contributory, examine into the conduct of such person and make an order requiring him to repay or restore the money or property or any part thereof with interest at such rate as the Registrar thinks just or to contribute such sum to the assets of such society by way of compensation concerning the misapplication, retainer, dishonesty or breach of trust as the Registrar considers fit.

Power of Registrar to make order for payment of money or restoration of property.

(2) This section shall apply notwithstanding that the act is one for which the offender may be criminally responsible.

48. Any person aggrieved by an order of the Registrar made under Section 47 may appeal to the Governor in Council within twenty-one days from the date of such order and the decision of the Governor shall be final and conclusive.

Appeal to Governor in Council.

## PART 9

## DISPUTES

49. (1) If any dispute touching the business of a registered society arises —

Settlement of disputes.

- (a) among members, past members and persons claiming through members, past members and deceased members; or
- (b) between a member, past member or person claiming through a member, past member or deceased member, and the society, its committee or any officer of the society; or
- (c) between the society or its committee and any officer of the society; or
- (d) between the society and any other registered society;

such dispute shall be referred to the Registrar for decision. A claim by a registered society for any debt or demand due to it from a member, past member or the nominee, heir or legal representative of a deceased member, shall be deemed to be a dispute touching the business of the society within the meaning of this subsection.

(2) The Registrar may, on receipt of a reference under subsection (1) —

- (a) decide the dispute himself; or
- (b) refer it for disposal to an arbitrator.

(3) Any party aggrieved by the award of the arbitrator or arbitrators may appeal therefrom to the Registrar within such period and in such manner as may be prescribed.

(4) A decision of the Registrar under subsection (2) or in appeal under subsection (3) shall be final and shall not be called in question in any civil court.

(5) The award of the arbitrator or arbitrators under subsection (2) shall, if no appeal is preferred to the Registrar under subsection (3), or if any such appeal is abandoned or withdrawn, be final and shall not be called in question in any civil court and shall be enforced in the same manner as if the award had been a judgment of a civil court.

Case stated on a question of law.

50. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 49 the Registrar at any time when proceeding to a decision under this Ordinance, or the Governor at any time when an appeal has been made to him against any decision of the Registrar under this Ordinance, may refer any question of law arising out of such decision for the ruling of the court.

(2) The ruling given on such question shall be final.

## PART 10

### RULES

Rules.

51. (1) The Governor may by Order in Council make all such rules as may be necessary for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to the principles and provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) In particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred by subsection (1), such rules may provide for —

- (a) forms to be used and the conditions to be complied with in applying for the registration of a society and the procedure for such applications;
- (b) conditions to be complied with by persons applying for admission or admitted as members, election and admission of members from time to time, and the payment to be made and interest to be acquired before exercising rights of membership;
- (c) subject to the provisions of Section 27, the maximum number of shares or portion of the capital of a registered society which may be held by a member;
- (d) the extent to which a registered society may limit the number of its members;
- (e) withdrawal and expulsion of members and payments to be made to members who withdraw or are expelled, and the liabilities of past members;
- (f) general meetings of the members and for the procedure at such meetings and the powers to be exercised by such meetings;
- (g) appointment, suspension and removal of the members of the committee and other officers, and the procedure at meetings of the committee, and the powers to be exercised and the duties to be performed by the committee and other officers;
- (h) matters in respect of which a society may or shall make by-laws and the procedure to be followed in making, altering and rescinding by-laws, and the conditions to be satisfied prior to such making, alteration or rescission;
- (i) the manner in which funds may be raised by means of shares or debentures or otherwise;
- (j) conditions to be observed by a registered society applying for financial assistance from Government;
- (k) the payments to be made, the conditions to be complied with and the forms of the bonds, instruments or other documents to be executed by members applying for loans or cash credits, the period for when the loans may be made or credits granted, and the maximum amount which may be lent and the maximum credit which may be allowed to individual members with or without the consent of the Registrar;
- (l) the manner in which the value of a deceased member's interest shall be ascertained, and for the nomination of a person to whom such interest may be paid or transferred;

- (m) the manner in which the value of the interest of a member who has become of unsound mind and incapable of managing himself or his affairs shall be ascertained and the nomination of any person to whom such interest may be paid or transferred;
- (n) formation and maintenance of reserve funds, and the objects to which such funds may be applied, and investment of any funds under the control of any registered society;
- (o) conditions under which profits may be distributed to the members of a society with unlimited liability and the maximum rate of dividend which may be paid by societies;
- (p) accounts and books to be kept by a registered society, and for the periodical publication of a balance sheet showing the assets and liabilities of a registered society;
- (q) audit of the accounts of registered societies and for the charges, if any, to be made for such audit and the levy of contributions from all or any registered societies to a fund to be used for the audit and supervision of existing societies and co-operative education and the administration of such a fund;
- (r) returns to be submitted by registered societies to the Registrar, and the persons by whom and the form in which the same are to be made;
- (s) the persons by whom, and the form in which, copies of entries in books of registered societies may be certified;
- (t) formation and maintenance of a register of members and where the liability of members is limited by shares, of a register of shares;
- (u) inspection of documents and registers at the Registrar's office and the fees to be paid therefor and the issue of copies of such documents or registers;
- (v) the manner in which any question as to the breach of any by-law or contract relating to the disposal of produce to or through a society may be determined, and the manner in which the liquidated damages for any such breach may be ascertained or assessed;
- (w) the mode of appointing an arbitrator or arbitrators and the procedure to be followed in proceedings before the Registrar or such arbitrator or arbitrators;
- (x) the procedure to be followed by a liquidator appointed under Section 41 and the cases in which appeals shall lie from the orders of such liquidator;
- (y) forms and fees and the procedure to be observed and all other matters connected with or incidental to the presentation, hearing and the disposal of appeals under this Ordinance or the rules.

## PART 11

### MISCELLANEOUS

52. (1) All sums due from a registered society or from an officer or member or past member of a registered society as such to the Government may be recovered in the manner provided for the recovery of debts due to the Government under the law for the time being in force.

Recovery of sums due to Government.

(2) Sums due from a registered society to the Government and recoverable under subsection (1) may be recovered first from the property of the society; secondly, in the case of a society of which the liability of members is limited, from members, subject to the limit of their liability; and thirdly, in the case of other societies, from the members.

Exemptions from registration requirements.

53. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Ordinance the Governor may by Order in Council, subject to such conditions as he may impose, exempt any society from any of the requirements of this Ordinance as to registration.

Exemptions of registered societies from provisions of Ordinance.

54. The Governor may by Order in Council exempt any registered society or class of registered societies from any of the provisions of this Ordinance, or may direct that such provisions shall apply to any registered society or class of registered societies with effect from such date or with such modifications as may be specified in the Order.

Exemptions from stamp duties or fees.

55. The Governor may by Order in Council exempt any registered society or class of registered societies from ---

- (a) the stamp duty with which, under any law for the time being in force, instruments executed by or on behalf of a registered society, or by an officer or member, and relating to the business of such society, or any class of such instruments as are respectively chargeable; or
- (b) any fee payable under the law of registration for the time being in force.

Prohibition of use of word "co-operative".

56. (1) No person other than a registered society shall trade or carry on business under any name or title of which the word "co-operative" is part without the authority of the Governor given by Order in Council.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of one hundred pounds and in the case of a continuing offence of a further fine of twenty pounds for each day during which the offence continues.

Certain laws not to apply to registered societies.

57. The Companies and Private Partnership Ordinance, and any law relating to trade unions, shall not apply to registered societies.

Offences and penalties.

58. (a) Any registered society or an officer or member thereof wilfully neglecting or refusing to do any act or to furnish any information required for the purposes of this Ordinance by the Registrar or other persons duly authorised by him in this behalf; and

(b) any person wilfully or without any reasonable excuse disobeying any summons, requisition or lawful written order issued under the provisions of this Ordinance, or failing to furnish any information lawfully required from him by a person authorised to do so under the provisions of this Ordinance

shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of five hundred pounds.

Penalty for fraud or misappropriation.

59. If any person obtains possession by false representation or imposition of any property of a society, or having it in his possession, withholds or misapplies it, or wilfully applies any part thereof to purposes other than those expressed or directed in the rules of the society, and authorised by this Ordinance, he shall, on the complaint of the society, or of any members authorised by the society, or the committee thereof, or of the Registrar, be liable to a fine of one thousand pounds, and to be ordered to deliver up all such property or to repay all moneys applied improperly, and in default of such delivery or repayment, or of the payment of such fine to be imprisoned for five years.

  - (b) from an abattoir within the EEC which conforms with European Council Directive 64/433/EEC or
  - (c) from an abattoir outside the EEC which conforms with European Council Directive 72/462/EEC  
or any United Kingdom Regulations or European Council Directives amending or replacing the regulations and directives referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).
2. No fertile eggs or animal semen shall be imported unless —
  - (a) a licence to import such eggs or semen has been granted by the Government Veterinary Officer and
  - (b) a health certificate in a form prescribed by the Government Veterinary Officer has been issued in respect of such eggs or semen.
3. No used shearing equipment shall be imported unless the same is presented for inspection by the Government Veterinary Officer and is cleaned and disinfected if so required by the Government Veterinary Officer.
4. Proclamations No. 5 of 1971 and No. 3 of 1973 shall be read subject to this Proclamation.
5. Proclamation No. 3 of 1968 is revoked.

## The Falkland Islands Constitution Order 1985

### The Constitutional (Registration of Electors) Regulations 1985

No. 1 of 1985.

In accordance with paragraph 2 of Schedule 3 to the Falkland Islands Constitution Order 1985 the Civil Commissioner makes the following Regulations —

Citation and commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Constitutional (Registration of Electors) Regulations 1985 and shall come into force on the 13th day of May 1985.

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires -  
 “Stanley Constituency” and “Camp Constituency” shall mean the constituencies provided for in Regulation 4 and “constituency” shall mean either of those constituencies;  
 “the Constitution” shall mean the Constitution set out in Schedule 1 to the Falkland Islands Constitution Order 1985;  
 “the Ordinance” shall mean the Legislative Council (Elections) Ordinance, Cap 37;  
 “the qualifying day” shall mean in respect of the General Election taking place next after the coming into force of these Regulations the 15th day of May 1985;  
 “qualifying period” shall mean the twelve months immediately preceding the qualifying day;  
 “resident” shall have the same meaning as given to “ordinarily resident” in Section 2 of the Ordinance.

Regulations to be read as one with the Ordinance.

3. These Regulations shall be read as one with the Ordinance except that where there is a conflict between these Regulations and the Ordinance these Regulations shall prevail.

Stanley and Camp Constituencies.

4. (1) For the purposes of election of members of the Legislative Council the Falkland Islands shall be divided into two constituencies namely the Stanley Constituency and the Camp Constituency.

(2) Stanley Constituency shall be all that area of the Falkland Islands within the radius of three and one half miles measured from the spire of Stanley Cathedral and Camp Constituency shall be the remainder of the Falkland Islands.

(3) Throughout the Ordinance the word “constituency” shall be substituted for the words “electoral area” or “electoral division” wherever they occur.

Registration and returning officers.

5. The Civil Commissioner shall appoint one or more registration officers and a returning officer for Stanley Constituency and the like for Camp Constituency.

Qualifications of Electors.

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-regulation (2), a person shall be qualified to be registered as an elector in a constituency for the purpose of the election of members of the Legislative Council if, and shall not be qualified unless, on the qualifying day he is normally resident in that constituency and —

- (a) he is a Commonwealth citizen;
- (b) he is eighteen years of age or over;
- (c) he has been resident in the Falkland Islands during the qualifying period and, in the case of a person who was not born in the Falkland Islands, he has also been resident in the Falkland Islands for an aggregate period of five years or more.

(2) No person shall be qualified to be registered as an elector under this regulation who on the qualifying day —

- (a) is a person certified to be insane or otherwise adjudged to be of unsound mind under any law;
- (b) is under sentence of death imposed on him by a court in any part of the Commonwealth or is serving a sentence of imprisonment (by whatever name called) for a term exceeding twelve months imposed on him by such a court or substituted by competent authority for some other sentence imposed on him by such court;
- (c) is incapable in accordance with Section 47 of the Ordinance of being registered as an elector or of voting;
- (d) is a member of the regular armed forces of Her Majesty, unless he is, for the purposes of Chapter I of the Constitution, regarded as belonging to the Falkland Islands; or
- (e) is, by virtue of his own act, under any acknowledgement of allegiance, obedience or adherence to a foreign Power or State.

(3) The provisions of Section 24 (3) of the Constitution shall apply for the purposes of sub-regulation (2) (b) as they apply for the purposes of Section 24 (1) (f) of the Constitution.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation a person who is normally resident in a constituency shall be taken as resident therein on the qualifying day notwithstanding his absence overseas or otherwise on that day if he intends to resume actual residence within six months from the date of his departure from the constituency.

(5) The reference in sub-regulation 2 (d) to a member of the regular armed forces of Her Majesty shall not include a reference to a member of the Falkland Islands Defence Force.

(6) Nothing in this regulation shall entitle a person to be registered in more than one constituency.

7. A register of electors for each constituency shall be prepared and published in accordance with Sections 8 and 8A of the Ordinance not later than the 2nd day of July 1985.

Publication of register of electors.

8. The Civil Commissioner may by Order in Council —

Forms.

- (a) amend, add to or replace the forms provided for in the First to the Fourth Schedule of the Ordinance;
- (b) provide for additional forms for the purposes of registration of electors and nomination for and election of candidates to the Legislative Council.

9. Section 11 (1) of the Ordinance shall be amended by the insertion after the word "Stanley" of the words "or not less than two justices as provided in subsection (2),".

Amendment of the Ordinance.

10. Sections 3, 3A, 4 and 6 of the Ordinance are repealed.

### The Constitutional (Qualification, nomination and election of candidates) Regulations 1985

No. 3 of 1985.

In accordance with paragraph 2 of Schedule 3 to the Falkland Islands Constitution Order 1985 the Civil Commissioner makes the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Constitutional (Qualification, nomination and election of candidates) Regulations 1985 and shall come into force on the 24th day of June 1985. Citation and commencement.
  
2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires - Interpretation.
  - “Stanley Constituency” and “Camp Constituency” shall mean the constituencies provided for in Regulation 4 of the Constitutional (Registration of Electors) Regulations 1985 and “constituency” shall mean either of those constituencies;
  - “the Constitution” shall mean the Constitution set out in Schedule 1 to the Falkland Islands Constitution Order 1985;
  - “the Ordinance” shall mean the Legislative Council (Elections) Ordinance, Cap 37;
  - “the qualifying day” shall mean in respect of the General Election taking place next after the coming into force of these Regulations the 15th day of May 1985;
  - “qualifying period” shall mean the twelve months immediately preceding the qualifying day;
  - “resident” shall have the same meaning as given to “ordinarily resident” in Section 2 of the Ordinance.
  
3. These Regulations shall be read as one with the Ordinance except that where there is a conflict between these Regulations and the Ordinance these Regulations shall prevail. Regulations to be read as one with the Ordinance.
  
4. There shall be eight elected members of Legislative Council four of whom shall represent Stanley Constituency and four of whom shall represent Camp Constituency. Elected Members of Legislative Council.
  
5. Subject to the disqualifications contained in Section 24 of the Constitution any citizen of a Commonwealth country who is of the age of twenty one years or more and is registered as an elector in the constituency in which he wishes to seek election and is not prohibited by the Ordinance or any other law from so voting shall be qualified to be elected as a member of Legislative Council. Qualifications of candidates.
  
6. (1) Any person who holds or is acting in a public office as defined by the Constitution and who is otherwise qualified to be elected as a member of the Legislative Council shall be qualified to be so elected except, subject to sub-regulation (2), any person who holds or is acting in the office of — Public officers who may be elected to Legislative Council.
  - (a) Agricultural Officer;
  - (b) Attorney General;
  - (c) Broadcasting Officer;
  - (d) Chief Executive;
  - (e) Chief Medical Officer;
  - (f) Civil Commissioner;
  - (g) Clerk of Councils;
  - (h) Collector of Customs and Harbour Master;
  - (i) Commissioner for Elections;

- (j) Crown Solicitor;
- (k) Development Officer;
- (l) Director of Civil Aviation;
- (m) Director of Public Works and his deputy;
- (n) Financial Secretary and his deputy;
- (o) General Manager of the Development Corporation whose office is hereby prescribed as a public office in accordance with Section 24 (4) (a) of the Constitution;
- (p) Government Secretary and his deputy;
- (q) Members of Her Majesty's Diplomatic Service whose offices are hereby prescribed as public offices in accordance with Section 24 (4) (a) of the Constitution;
- (r) Members of the Judiciary excluding Justices of the Peace who do not hold or act in the office of magistrate or higher judicial office;
- (s) Members of the police force;
- (t) Principal Auditor;
- (u) Registrar General;
- (v) Superintendent of Education;
- (w) Superintendent of Posts and Telecommunications.

(2) A person holding or acting in any office referred to in subregulation (1) except those referred to in paragraphs (f) and (q) thereof may stand as a candidate for election to Legislative Council if prior to his nomination as a candidate he serves on the Civil Commissioner an undertaking in writing to relinquish or, as the case may be, to cease to act in the said office if he is elected as a member of Legislative Council.

(3) If a person to whom sub-regulation (2) applies is elected to Legislative Council he shall not take his seat until he has fulfilled his undertaking and if he has not fulfilled his undertaking within thirty days of being so elected his seat shall fall vacant.

#### Unopposed candidates.

7. Where four candidates and no more are nominated for a constituency in accordance with the Ordinance the returning officer shall declare the candidates to be elected and shall forthwith endorse such election on the writ of election and return it to the Civil Commissioner who shall cause a notice of such election to be published in the Gazette.

#### Lack of candidates.

8. (1) Where less than four candidates are nominated for a constituency in accordance with the Ordinance the returning officer shall declare the election for that constituency void and the Civil Commissioner shall forthwith issue a new writ of election in accordance with Section 13 of the Ordinance which shall specify a day for nomination of candidates not later than thirty days from the issue of the writ.

(2) Where less than four candidates are nominated after the issue of a new writ of election under subregulation (1) the returning officer shall declare the candidates to be elected and shall forthwith endorse such election on the writ of election and return it to the Civil Commissioner who shall cause a notice of such election to be published in the Gazette.

(3) Where candidates are declared elected unopposed under subregulation (2) the Civil Commissioner shall issue a further writ or writs of election in accordance with Section 13 of the Ordinance and subregulation (1) until the vacant seats are filled.

#### Votes and manner of voting.

9. (1) Each elector may vote for such number of candidates as there are vacant seats in the constituency in which he is entitled to vote and no more.

(2) If an elector votes for less candidates than there are vacant seats his vote or votes shall be validly cast.

(3) If an elector votes for more candidates than there are vacant seats his votes shall not be validly cast and shall not be counted.

(4) The elector shall mark the ballot paper at the place provided for voting by placing the mark "X" and no other mark, writing or signature opposite the name of each candidate whom he selects.

(5) The elector shall fold the ballot paper so as to conceal his vote and place it so folded in the ballot box.

(6) The elector shall vote without undue delay and leave the polling station as soon as he has cast his vote.

10. A person may vote by proxy in the manner provided for in the Schedule to these Regulations. Proxy vote.

11. (1) The returning officer shall immediately upon completion of the counting of votes declare the number of candidates who equal the number of vacant seats counting down from the candidate who obtains the highest number of votes to be elected. Declaration of poll.

(2) If two or more candidates receive the same number of votes and if one candidate only had received those votes he would have been declared elected but because of the equality of votes it is not possible to declare a person elected to one or more seats as there would be more persons elected than seats the returning officer shall declare that seat or seats to be vacant and the persons with an equality of votes shall not be elected.

(3) When the returning officer makes a declaration under sub-regulation (2) the Civil Commissioner shall issue a further writ or writs of election in accordance with Section 13 of the Ordinance until the vacant seats are filled.

(4) The returning officer shall endorse the name of each successful candidate on the writ of election and forthwith return the writ to the Civil Commissioner who shall cause a notice of such election to be published in the Gazette.

12. The Ordinance is amended by —

(a) in Section 16 (3), the substitution of £50 for £25 and the addition before the full stop at the end of that subsection of the words "or shall be delivered by post on or before 12 noon on the same day and at the same place";

(b) the renumbering of Section 32 as "32 (1)" and the addition of the following subsection to that section —

(i) the addition at the end of subsection (1) of "(d) the Attorney General";

(ii) the insertion in subsection (3) after the word "petitioner" of the words "unless he be the Attorney General".

## SCHEDULE

### RULES FOR VOTING BY PROXY

#### PART 1

Application to vote by proxy.

1. (1) A person may only vote by proxy if he can demonstrate that by reason of —

- (a) occupation,
- (b) health,
- (c) religion, or
- (d) temporary absence overseas

he is unable to vote in person in his constituency.

(2) A person to whom sub-rule (1) applies and who wishes to vote by proxy may apply to a Registration Officer for the constituency in which he is entitled to vote by the completion and submission of Form A in Part 2.

(3) A person who is prevented from voting in person by reason of his occupation shall accompany his application with, if self employed, a statutory declaration in Form B in Part 2, or if not self employed, with a certificate signed by his head of department, superior officer, manager or other person to whom he is responsible dealing or certifying as the case may be as to his inability to vote in person and the reason therefor.

(4) A person who is prevented from voting in person by reason of health shall accompany his application with a certificate by a recognised medical practitioner or nurse or on the unavailability of any such person of standing certifying as to his inability to vote in person and the reason therefor.

(5) A person who professes to be prevented from voting in person by reason of religious obligations shall accompany his application by a certificate of a Minister of his religion that confirms that he cannot vote for reasons of religion.

(6) A person who is prevented from voting in person by reason of temporary absence overseas shall accompany his application with a statutory declaration in Form B in Part 2.

(7) Every application under sub-rule (2) shall reach the Registration Officer not less than seven days before polling. The Registration Officer may in his absolute discretion accept a later application.

Decision of Registration Officer.

2. (1) If the Registration Officer who receives such application under Rule 1 (2) is satisfied that —

- (a) the applicant is entitled to vote by proxy, and
- (b) the person named as proxy is registered in the same register of electors as the applicant

he shall so inform the applicant in Form C in Part 2 and deliver by post or other means the completed proxy form in Form D in Part 2 to the proxy named by the applicant.

(2) For the purpose of sub-rule (1) the Registration Officer shall be deemed to have delivered the proxy form if he makes known to the proxy that the form is available for collection at the polling station on polling day.

(3) If a Registration Officer who receives an application under Rule 1 (2) is not satisfied that the applicant is entitled to vote by proxy he shall so inform the applicant in Form C in Part 2.

(4) If a Registration Officer although being satisfied that an applicant under Rule 1 (2) is entitled to vote by proxy but that the person nominated as proxy is not eligible to be a proxy for the

applicant he shall so inform the applicant in Form C in Part 2 and invite him to nominate another person provided that in his opinion the applicant will be able to make such nomination not less than 72 hours before polling.

3. (1) An elector may revoke a proxy by notice in writing to a Registration Officer.

Revocation of proxies and further applications.

(2) An elector who has revoked a proxy may apply for the issue of another.

4. An elector who has obtained the issue of a proxy may vote in person provided he does so before his proxy votes on his behalf.

Elector who has obtained issue of proxy may vote in person.

5. (1) Where the elector or his proxy dies or ceases to be eligible to vote a proxy shall become null and void.

Proxy nullified on death or cessation of eligibility of his proxy.

(2) The Registration Officer shall recover the proxy form.

6. (1) No elector may cast a proxy vote for more than two other electors.

Limitations on voting by proxy.

(2) If more than two proxies are made out in the name of the same elector the two earliest in time shall be valid.

(3) If more than two proxies issued to an elector bear the same date the elector shall be required by the returning officer at his polling station to choose those two under which he will cast votes and surrender any others.

(4) The returning officer shall cause any elector whose proxy is invalid to be so informed without undue delay.

7. (1) An elector voting as a proxy voter shall vote for the person for whom he is proxy in the same manner as he casts his own vote.

Manner of voting by proxy and casting of own vote.

(2) If an elector voting as a proxy wishes to cast his own vote he must do it at the same time as he votes as proxy.

(3) When a person votes as proxy he must produce the proxy form authorising him to vote as proxy.

We, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870, section 2 (3) of the Decimal Currency Act 1967, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

1. This Proclamation shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Falkland Islands and shall come into force there on the date of such publication.

2. (1) The following new coins, being coins of the denomination of fifty pence, of a standard weight of 28.2759 grammes, a standard diameter of 38.608 millimetres and a circular shape, shall be made —

- (a) a silver coin of millesimal fineness 925; and
- (b) a cupro-nickel coin of a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel.

(2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or millesimal fineness specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1296 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said millesimal fineness of 5.

(3) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say —

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1296 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.

3. The design for each coin shall be as follows —

- (a) For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "QUEEN ELIZABETH II" to the left of the portrait, with "FALKLAND ISLANDS" to the right and at the bottom "50 PENCE".

(b) For the reverse impression a portrait of His Royal Highness The Prince Andrew with the inscription "OPENING OF MOUNT PLEASANT AIRPORT MAY 1985".

(c) Every coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

4. The said coins shall be current within Our Colony of the Falkland Islands.

GIVEN at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighty-five and in the thirty-fourth year of Our Reign.
